## Who Is Tanya Abrams?


A path that takes someone from North Bay, to New York City, Kingston, Southern California, Winnipeg, Rankin Inlet, Yellowknife and Joyceville, has to yield some fascinating life experiences and result in some well-grounded values. And this is exactly what has happened to Tanya Abrams.

Tanya's childhood experiences, where she, like so many of us felt some failures on the physical fitness front, began to shape her current attitudes about the importance of finding ways for anyone to be 'active', no matter the barriers. As a teen, Tanya observed the supportive hospice care provided to her father, and the 'giving' work of others in her family, and became convinced she wanted to work in health care. Later, her early nursing training and postings in some of Canada's more isolated northern communities, deepened her awareness of people's ability to overcome adversity, and thrive, no matter their circumstances.

Eventually Tanya and her husband moved back south to raise their children closer to family, and after a few years working in Kingston, Tanya got a chance to work even closer to home when she was appointed as the Nurse Practitioner in the rural family medical centre at Seeley's Bay. Here she decided that her 'wellness education' responsibilities might be best-filled by helping to provide opportunities for active living for everyone here, no matter their ability, and "Seeley's Bay Athletics" was created. Over the years since the nonprofit club was created, there has been an outdoor walking program, 'chair' yoga, a clogging class, aerobics, a triathlon group, a paddling group, and the activities just keep on evolving. Tanya's commitment is to keep the program free of charge (donations are welcomed), and the activities sufficiently accessible, so that people with financial limitations, mobility challenges, etc., can all feel comfortable to participate.

In the spring of 2011 the Seeley's Bay and Area Residents' Association jumped at the chance to host the Hansen Relay tour and instantly agreed that Tanya Abrams was the perfect person to represent our community as a Hansen Medal Bearer because she is a genuine 'difference maker'. When Tanya was first approached about the possibility, she said "I would do anything to support Rick Hansen; I think he is an amazing role model for all of us".
