SPRING OPENER FESTIVAL

The 2013 Seeley's Bay Spring Opener will soon be here! The list of activities is still growing but the highlights include village-wide yard sales, a vendor's alley along Main Street, a 'silly boat race' with area firefighters and emergency workers competing in handmade cardboard boats, the annual firefighters' chicken BBQ, a very special concert with Sheesham, Lotus and Son, a bowfin derby, a children's activity area, a military field ambulance and hospital tent, and a silent poker run for kayaks and canoes. So, whether you want to shop, play on the water, watch others play, and/or kick up your heels, there is something for everyone. The festival is a project of the Seeley's Bay Area Residents' Association to help support our local businesses and to welcome more visitors to our community. Any proceeds will go towards continued village improvements and the Seeley's Bay Steps Up project.

SEELEY'S BAY STEPS UP

We are happy to report that everyone will soon see more signs of progress on the Steps Up project. All of the new outdoor furniture has been ordered by the An outcrop has been removed at Township. Haskin's Point to allow for more parking and rocks have been put into the deeply-eroded area near the swimming hole. The old asphalt from the ferry ramp has been removed, and a platform will be created over the rock infill by the swimming area - all with Parks Canada approval. The furnishings will be installed, as well as some landscaping, over the summer. Also, watch for a new interpretive sign that will help tell the story of the history of the Point. We also expect to see the **new parkettes** put in place over the summer, and more interpretive signs. And the **new banners**, featuring the new logo, should be up by Victoria Day.

SBARA has been meeting regularly with Township officials to oversee progress on the Steps Up projects. A grant from the **Trillium Foundation** is helping to finance the Haskin's Point work, and a grant from the 1000 Islands Community Development Corporation is helping to pay for some of the new furniture, new signs and the branding work. significant amount of the furniture purchase is thanks to generous donations from this community - we are so appreciative of the many families who will be dedicating a bench, bike rack, picnic table etc. Once most of the construction is in place, we will be announcing an event to officially 'open' the sites and to thank our donors.

Big Thank You – When communities have a lot of things going on, it is usually because there are a lot of volunteers working hard to make things happen. Two exceptional volunteers in this community are Marg Brooker and Karen Simpson. Marg and Karen have been heading up the annual Frost Fest event for a number of years – with great success.
