



The Seeley's Bay Area Residents' Association has now started working on Phase 2 with funding from the Rural Economic Development (RED) program of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA). This project will roll out over 2 years and include new directional signage within the village to point visitors to public services; a landmark on the Rideau at Haskin's to show boaters the entrance to the village, more village streetscape improvements, some assistance for local businesses who would like to build on the Seeley's Bay brand, and more.
